

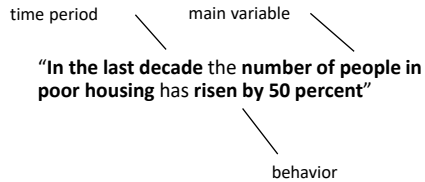
Step 2 - What's the problem?

Write a problem statement to identify the behavior under study and describe how it has evolved over a specific time period.

A problem statement succinctly describes how behavior has evolved over a period of time.

It gives your work a clear focus and purpose.

A problem statement always has three parts.



Example : All three parts of the problem statement were contained in the article. This is not always the case.

France's homeless problem appears particularly acute. In the last decade the number of people in poor housing has risen by 50 percent. This affects more than 3.5 million French. Just under 150,000 are living on the street.
